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Elliott Hundley, *Ritual*, 2026 (Regen Projects)

Elliott Hundley: *Book of Sand* opens Wednesday, September 16, 6-8pm at Regen Projects.

Hundley is the master of an accumulative style, wherein constructed sprawl and mountains of infinitesimal detail tell their own tale of psychology and perform obsession alongside the materially outrageous works of art themselves. Though this be madness, there is method in it, as over the years Hundley has evolved and experimented and cited classical myth, theater, and literature as armatures around which to swirl. For this body of work, the lens is a bit more inward, in a Jungian kind of way which reframes the works as psychological landscapes where the bevy of personal artifacts, detritus, pins, and papers map the labyrinthine, shifting currents of memory and identity. Disparate elements—from raw studio scrap and encaustic to precious family mementos—are meticulously pinned and bound into multi-dimensional surfaces that evoke ancient votive objects, capturing the tension between what we choose to preserve, and what chooses us.
